

2022 Mountaineer Strawberry 2700 Championships

2700 | .22 Rimfire | Service Pistol | Service Revolver

Date & Time: May 21st & 22nd 2022, firing begins at 9:00AM EST, on Saturday and 8:00AM Sunday. Friday May 20th is sight-in, practice, & camper setup day

Location: White Horse Center, County Route 20/3, Crouse Road, Peeltree, WV.
Google Maps Destination: 127 White Horse Lane, Philippi, WV 26416

Eligibility: Open to all eligible competitors. No membership is required to participate. There are 24 firing points per relay.

Entry Fees: A package entry fee of \$60 includes firing all three (3) stages; .22, Center-Fire and .45 in the Precision Pistol 2700 over both days of the competition. Should a competitor wish to fire in only one (1) or two (2) stages of the 2700, the entry fee will be \$25 per stage. There is no entry fee for Junior Shooters entering the 2700. CMP Sanctioned EIC Service Pistol & .22 Rimfire matches entry fees are \$20 for each match.

Classification: Competitors shall fire in their classification, subject to *Rule §3.11 2022 CMP PISTOL COMPETITION RULES*. *Unclassified* competitors will compete in the Unclassified Master Class

Awards: The 1st, 2nd & 3rd place Open Winners of the 2700 match will receive Championship Medals. The Gold Medal Open Winner will also receive \$100 cash. Medals and Leg Points for the CMP EIC Service Pistol & .22 Rimfire Match will be provided by the CMP. Gold & Silver Medals will be awarded to 1st 2nd place in the Marksman, Sharpshooter, Expert, Master and High Master classes. The award schedule for the 2700 will be based on a minimum of five (5) entries per class. If less than five (5) entries in a class, that class may be combined with the next higher class at the discretion of the Match Sponsor, except that no classes will be combined with the Master & High Master Class. Special awards include High Woman, High Junior, High Senior, and High Grand Senior, and a .22 all-stages winner. The high scoring Tyro (beginner) shooter firing a .22 caliber through all stages will receive a medal.

Rules & Course of Fire: Current CMP rules apply to all matches. Challenge fees are \$1. Upheld challenge fees will be returned. Targets will be: 50 yard slow fire B-6; 25 yard timed and rapid fire B-8. Course of fire for each gun of the 2700, will be: 2 slow fire targets, the National Match Course, 2 timed fire targets and 2 rapid fire targets. EIC Service Pistol, Service Revolver & .22 Rimfire Matches will be the National Match Course. The Jury System will be utilized throughout the tournament.

Registration: Advance entries are requested via US Mail and paid by check or money order. Please be aware that we cannot process credit card payments. Full

registration for all matches will receive priority. Competitors that do not pre-register will not be assured their entry. Early registrations exceeding range capacity may result in a second relay. Registrations exceeding that will be placed on a wait list. Entry postmarks will be used to determine availability. Walk-up entries for the full 2700 or individual matches will be accepted on a space-available basis.

General Information: Empty Chamber Indicators (ECIs), eye and hearing protection are mandatory. The range is equipped with electronically-timed turning targets, and covered firing points. Should entries for the EIC Service Pistol, .22 Rimfire or Service Revolver Matches exceed range capacity; preference will be shown to non-distinguished competitors. Triggers may be weighed and ammunition checked for EIC Matches. A random trigger weight check of pistols used in the 2700 may be made before or after a relay.

EIC Matches require a minimum of six (6) non-distinguished shooters to constitute a legitimate match. The best way to ensure a match is to bring friends.

Food & Refreshments: Breakfast & Dinner will be on your own; however, light lunch & refreshments will be available at the range Saturday & Sunday.

Camping Facilities: Primitive camping is available at the range, at no charge. However, there are no electrical, water or sewer hook-ups available. Portable toilet facilities will be provided. Campers should be self-contained.

Security Services: No security services will be provided by Brassmasters or the White Horse Center; it is therefore suggested that personal valuables be kept in a secure location

Lodging: Listed below are visitors & convention bureau links to the nearby towns of Buckhannon, Bridgeport, Clarksburg and Weston, WV. Food and lodging accommodations are readily available in these towns and are approximately 20-30 minutes drive from the range, depending on the location chosen.
